AS WE ARE GATHERED BY THE CROSS

Today, we take our cue from the namesake of our congregation, St. Peter. The Confession of St. Peter reverberates in our ears, beckoning our mouths to confess in word and our lives to respond in deed. Peter's confession of Christ's nature, revealed not by men but by God, is a foundation upon which Christ built the church. Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of the living God. Many of the crumbling spires in western Christendom are attributable to the fact that people have simply stopped believing that Jesus is the Christ. If human beings thought that God was present in these places, if they believed that Jesus spoke to them the Truth of right now and eternity, they would be there on Sunday morning, supporting and worshiping and serving. Too many churches, however, have built upon the sandy foundations of whatever popular winds might be blowing through culture and society. This Sunday calls us back to our first love (Rev 2:4) and the confession upon which the church was built, that Jesus is the Christ.

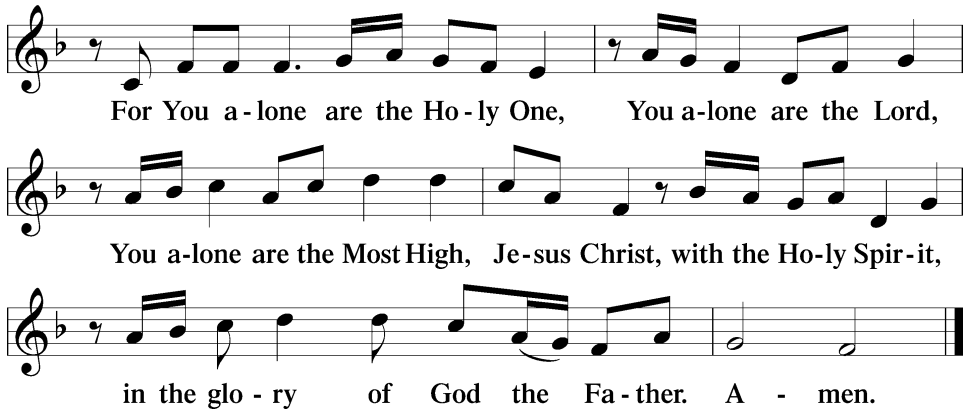

Joyful Confession Do we, too often, *grumpily* confess that Jesus is the only way to heaven, speaking our “no” to anyone whose confession or faith we consider inadequate? What do you imagine a joyful confession of this truth would look like? Did the authors of the prayer imagine that we have joy, that a joyful confession means we are sharing good news with others and not a denunciation or disapproval of them? The progression in Peter’s epistle today might be the key to the joyful confession of this truth.

¹²Therefore I intend always to remind you of these qualities, though you know them and are established in the truth that you have. ¹³I think it right, as long as I am in this body, to stir you up by way of reminder, ¹⁴since I know that the putting off of my body will be soon, as our Lord Jesus Christ made clear to me. ¹⁵And I will make every effort so that after my departure you may be able at any time to recall these things.

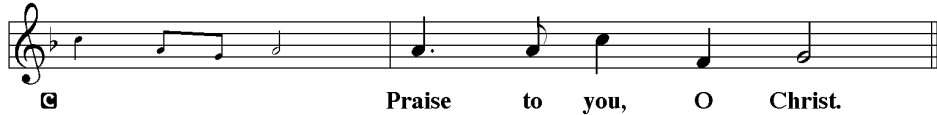

The Lord's Supper is joyfully received here today. At the altar, our Lord Jesus Christ gives us a tremendous gift. His body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine forgives our sins, strengthens our faith, binds us to the Lord, and embodies our unity with one another. Accordingly, in 1 Corinthians 11, St. Paul cautions Christians to receive the Supper together only when they are united in a common faith and love. If you are new to our congregation, please see the pastor before communing.

- * *Those not communing are invited to come forward for a blessing, indicating so by crossing your arms over your chest.*
- * *Those communing will receive the host from the pastor and may receive the consecrated wine by Common Cup OR Individual Cup.*
 - *Common Cup: Offered by the elder, by guiding the base of the cup with your hand.*
 - *Individual Cup: Available as you process down the center aisle from the individual cup dispenser. Twist and pull upward to receive an empty cup. An elder will fill your cup at the altar. Place the used individual cup in the collection basket.*



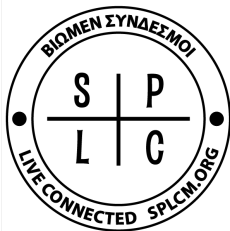
